ATIL Hall of Fame Inductees and Awardees Honored for Trucking Achievements

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (October 31, 2023) – Congratulations to the six titans of the trucking world who were inducted into the American Trucking and Industry Leader Hall of Fame on Oct. 25 at the American Truck Historical Society in Kansas City, Missouri. This was a true celebration of the history of trucking with the appearance of Kenworth trucks from almost every decade; American Trucking Associations Interstate One Truck, a classroom on wheels with a state-of-the-art simulator; the Kenworth 100-year history trailer; Schneider's 75-anniversary truck and Goodyear's infamous Wingfoot Express, which played a pivotal role in revolutionizing long-haul trucking and laying the foundation for the modern transportation industry.

ATIL Hall of Fame Chair, Tom Mullen (Linesville, Pennsylvania) commented, "The ATHS Hall of Fame certainly reached a new level of participation and support today.
