ATHS will begin accepting 2025 scholarship applications in **Dec. 1, 2024**. Students must attend regular classes, maintain a minimum 3.0 GPA, and be a family member (child, stepchild, or grandchild) of a current ATHS member in good standing for two years to be eligible for the **George Schroyer Memorial** and **Cummins** scholarships. The **Lewis Semple Clark Educational Fund** scholarship is restricted to Autocar Company employees and family members (child, stepchild, or grandchild) with a minimum 3.0 GPA. Preference for all scholarships will be given to applicants pursuing positions in the trucking or transportation industry.
