

Volunteer Position Description

Unloading/Loading/Transport Parking

Thank you for helping in this important position! This area is critical to many of our attendees as they bring some amazing vehicles in on trailers. The most important thing you can do in this area is be patient! Some of these drivers don't back trailers everyday so it might take them a time or two to get it right. Just help as much as you can, and don't get run over!

- There are two ramps, high & low. Help the drivers determine the best one for them to use. There is also a space for self-unloaders if they are able to utilize this area.
- This area can become congested depending on the day and time. Let everyone know they will get their chance and if they need to go do something else and come back, that is okay. Impress on them to be patient and visit if they would like.
- However! Don't let them leave their vehicle unattended. Any vehicles left in the loading/unloading area can and will be towed. There is too much traffic in this area to allow for them to park there.
- Once they are finished unloading, they will need to park their transport vehicle/trailer in the assigned lot.
- All transport vehicles/trailers need to have an identification tag. This should have the owners name, phone number and approximate departure time. These tags are wire tags and you can use a sharpie to write the information on them.
- Once they have finished unloading and parking, they can continue to truck wash and/or the truck registration area.
- When loading, make sure the vehicle to be loaded is ready to go. There is no waiting at the dock for the vehicle to get there.

Special notes: If you have an issue with a vehicle there are skid steers available to help. We may also have tow vehicles or other special equipment depending on the venue. Ask or call the lead in charge of this area or the event manager. Numbers are located on the back of this description.
